Our Sanstha:

Wai, a town in the hilly area, is situated on the bank of the river Krishna in Satara district of Maharashtra, After the independence of India, there was only primary and secondary level education available in Wai tehsil. There were no other arenas of higher education in the town until 1961 and the vouth in and around Wai had no other choice other than farming or working or seeking for higher education outside, However, Deshbhakta Kisan Mahadev alias Abasaheb Veer (Veteran Leader & Freedom Fighter) along with some eminent people who had zeal to transform the town altogether formed "Janata Mahavidvalava Sameeti" on 16th July 1961. As Sameeti was not registered. Abasaheb Veer started the Arts and Commerce College. Wai under the aegis of Prainapathshalamandal. Wai with the help of Tarkateertha Laxmanshastri Joshi. a renowned Sanskrit scholar, in 1962. Later Abasaheb Veer founded Janata Shikshan Sanstha on 12th July 1967 duly registering it with Registrar of Societies (under The Societies Act, 1960) and Assistant Charity Commissioner. Kolhapur (under Bombay Public Trust Act 1950), The college was handed over to Janata Shiskhan Sanstha, Wai on 1st April 1968, The college made a humble beginning with only Arts and Commerce faculties in 1962, but soon the M.Com. Classes were inaugurated by Dr. Appasaheb Pawar, the then Vice Chancellor of Shivaii University, Kolhapur on 4th July 1969. In 1973, the Postgraduate Departments of Marathi and English were added. The undergraduate classes of the college got the permanent affiliation of the University in 1982. The post-graduate classes in Commerce, English and Marathi also got permanent affiliation. In 1982, the Sanstha introduced Science Faculty under the dynamic leadership of Hon. Prataprao Bhosale. An additional building consisting of wellequipped science laboratories, classrooms, etc. was constructed and completed around that time. In 1980 the college was renamed as Kisan Veer Mahavidyalaya, Wai to commemorate the pioneering educational work of Abasaheb Veer to the generations to come. Now the institution has colleges and schools as follows: Kisan Veer Senior Mahavidyalaya, Wai; Kisan Veer Junior Mahavidyalaya, Wai; Madhyamik Vidyalay, Khanapur; New English School, Vyajwadi; Madhyamik Vidyalay, Shirgaon; Arvind Pawar (Patil) Madhyamik Vidyalaya, Vele; New English School, Dhawadi; Laxmibai Veer Madhyamik Vidyalaya, Shendurjane and Madhyamik Vidyalay, Govedigar, Hon, Prataprao Bhosale, Former President, Janata Shikshan Sanstha, Wai, with his deep sense of humanity started Residential Hostel with necessary facilities of free lodging /boarding/college education besides uniforms/daily ware clothes/educational stationary, etc for the sons of bereaved families affected due to the suicidal deaths of farmers of Rural Maharashtra. The Management organizes a

Programme called "Gunagourav of the Students and Teachers" (Annual Appreciation Day) on the occasion of the Foundation Day (12th July) of Janata Shikshan Sanstha, Wai every year and felicitates meritorious students. The Management organizes Guest Lectures on profound thoughts and ideas of great thinkers and freedom fighters from time to time. The Management allows the faculty adequate freedom in performing various duties and responsibilities in tune with the vision and mission of the institution.

Our College:

Kisan Veer Mahavidyalya, Wai is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur and is one of the best rural colleges of the University in terms of academic, cultural, NSS, NCC, and Sports achievements. The college was accredited in 2004, re-accredited in 2013 and accredited in the third cycle in 2019 by National Assessment and Accreditation Council, Bangalore, Recently, the college has introduced M. Sc. (Organic Chemistry) course. At present, there are about 6000 students taking Higher Secondary, Under-graduate and Post- Graduate education in our college. We have additional student strength of about 2000 under the Yashwantrao Chavan Maharashtra Open University, Nashik, The college imparts education in Arts. Commerce and Science faculties along with the degree course in Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA), Our NCC unit is vibrant and our cadets have received awards and recognition at the State and National levels. Our NSS unit has organized labour camp at the village Pasarni along with the extension activities and taken initiatives in organizing Blood Donation Camps, Tree Plantation, Literacy Mission, AIDs Awareness, Voters Awareness, Pulse Polio, Nirmal Gram Yojana, etc. The college has adopted such measures as Earn and Learn Scheme, Parent-Teacher Scheme, Book Bank, Career Counselling, etc. The students have bagged medals/awards/recognition in Athletics, Mallkhamb, Archery, etc. at the University, State, and National levels. The support services of the college include well-equipped science Laboratories, Library & Information Centre, Women's Hostel, Boys Hostel, Indoor Sports Facility, Playground, Canteen, Students' Cooperative Store run by the Staff and Students, Health Care Centre, Students' Lunch Corner, Parking, 24x7 Security CCTV Surveillance, Botanical Garden with lawns and canopy plants, etc., In 1962, the strength of the college was only 80. At present, it is more than six thousand. The growth of the college is not only quantitative, but also highly qualitative. Our students have excelled in the academic, cultural, sports, NSS and NCC fields at the university, state, national and occasionally at international levels. Many of our students have occupied good positions in administration, industry, banking, research, and corporate world. The faculty of our college is well-qualified.



IX. ADMISSION RULES, REFUND OF FEES AND ELIGIBILITY

Preamble

- a) In accordance with the provisions of the Maharashtra Public Universities Act 2016, the following rules shall be called the Admission Rules to be applicable to the non-professional under-graduate and post-graduate courses in the college.
- b) The admission rules for professional courses shall be as prescribed by the State Government from time to time. These rules have come into force from the Academic Year 2019-20 onward.

Undergraduate Courses:

- **A.R.1** Admissions to non-professional undergraduates shall be strictly based on:
 - a) Eligibility criteria as prescribed by the University from time to time.
 - b) Reservation rules as prescribed by the State Government from time to time and adopted by the University.
 - c) Merit, as measured by the marks scored in the qualifying previous examination.
- A.R.2 The total intake capacity at the first point of the admission to the Senior College shall be divided as 80 per cent for the attached Junior College and 20 per cent for other Junior Colleges. However, in both cases the basic rules of merit, reservation & eligibility shall be applied. If 20 per cent quota remains unutilized, students from the attached junior college shall be admitted from the waiting list. The merit of the students from other Junior Colleges shall not be less than the merit of the last student admitted from the attached Junior College. In case, 80 per cent quota for the attached Junior College remains unutilized, the College shall have the right to admit students from other Junior

- Colleges subject to the general rules given above.
- **A.R.3** In view of the problem of drop out, the additional 10 per cent of the sanctioned intake capacity may be admitted in the college subject to the general rules of the admission given above.
- **A.R.4** In case of admissions to the second and third year of the integrated degree course, preference will be given to the students of the same college.
- **A.R.5** There shall be an Admission Committee for the proper monitoring of admissions. After preparing the merit list, the merit list along with the waiting list shall be displayed on the college notice board/website for the information of the students.
- **A.R.6** Husband/wife/son/daughter and brother/sister of both the teaching and non-teaching employees (on probation or confirmed) will be given admissions to the courses within a limit of 3 per cent of the total intake capacity subject to intra group merit considerations.
- **A.R.7** In case of physically challenged students seeking admission to the first year of the integrated degree course the Admission Committee may use its discretion subject to the fulfillment of other conditions of admission.
- **A.R.8** The foreign students shall be admitted to any course in the college on production of provisional eligibility certificate from the University.
- **A.R.9** Cancellation of Admission and Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates (As per UGC Notification October 2018)

Cancellation of admission and refund of fees shall be as under:

- All Deposits such as Caution Money, Library Deposit, Laboratory Deposit etc. shall be refundable subject to such deductions as may be necessary on account of any damage to the property of the institution concerned such as breakages to laboratory equipment, loss of library books etc. for which a student may be responsible.
- 2) If a student chooses to withdraw his/her admission in which he/she is enrolled the college will follow the following five tier system for refund of the fees remitted by the student.

Sr. No.	Percentage of Refund of Fees	Point of time when notice of withdrawal of admission is received
1	100 %	15 days or more before formally-notified last date of admission
2	90 %	Less than15 days before formally-notified last date of admission
3	80 %	15 days or before formally-notified last date of admission
4	50 %	30 days or less, but more than 15 days, after formally-notified last date of admission
5	00 %	More than 30 days after formally-notified last date of admission

The college will refund fees to eligible students within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application form.

- 3) Verification and non-retention of student's Academic and Personal Certificates:
- Students should not submit their original academic and personal certificates like Mark-sheets, Leaving Certificates and other such documents at the time of submitting their admission forms, but the submission of self-attested copies thereof will be mandatory.

- The college will physically verify original documents at the time of admission of the students in their presence and return them immediately after satisfying about their authenticity. The self-attested copies of the required documents will be kept for the official record.
- The self-attested certificates of the students shall be held valid and by the college for all purposes and administrative requirements and should there be a need for physical verification at any time during the course of the program of study, such verification shall be undertaken and the original certificates thus used for verification shall be returned immediately to the students concerned.
- Taking the certificates into institutional custody under any circumstance or pretext is strictly prohibited.
- In case of any suspicion over the authenticity or genuineness of a certificate, reference may be made to the University or the Board which issues the certificate to the student and the admission will be subjected to the authentication, but original certificate shall not be retained by the college under any circumstance.
- **A.R.10** At Part-1,2 and 3 levels, efforts are by the college to ensure a fair distribution of admissions to different special subjects.
- **A.R.11** The admissions are completely governed by the rules and regulations made by the University from time to time. A copy of such rules and regulations will be displayed on the notice board and website of the college during the period of admission.
- **A.R.12** Rules and regulations regarding admission fees, tuition fees, and various other fees charged by the colleges at under-graduate level shall be governed by the provisions of ordinance as prescribed by the University from time to time. Eligibility: HSC or any equivalent examination passed student is eligible for admission to the first year degree course (B.A./B.Com./B.Sc)

Admission Procedure:

- Those students who seek admission for B, A, /B. Com/B.Sc./M.A./M. Com Part-I Courses must open their ABC accounts (Academic Bank of Credits) on Digi Locker & submit their IDs to the college office at the time of admission.
- 2) Only Active Email ID and Active / valid mobile numbers must be used for registration and at the time for admission form submission.
- 3) One student with his/her one Email ID & active/valid mobile number can submit only one admission form for the selected class/faculty. If not so, your admission form will lead to rejection.
- 4) Your Active mobile number and valid email ID will be used by college authority for sending instructions for online video lectures and online attendance.
- 5) Notification regarding online admission will be given separately on the college website www.kvmwai.edu.in
- It is mandatory to all the students to subscribe the following YouTube Channel Link and join Facebook Page of Kisan Veer Mahavidyalaya at the time of their admissions otherwise their admissions will be led to cancellation:




