




Short Term Course Meeting Minutes

Paper No. 1. ECONOMY AND PLANNING

1.1. Indian Economy challenges in Indian Economy – Poverty, Unemployment and Regional Imbalance. Planning Process – Types – Review of India's First to tenth Five Year Plans and Evaluation. Social and Economic Indicators of Development. State and Local Level Planning. Decentralization – 73rd and 74th constitutional Amendment.

Report of "Certificate Course in Economics"

A short term course entitled "Certificate Course in Economics" was organized by Department of Economics from 12th September 2022 to 15th December 2022. Economics is most important and major subject for competitive exams like MPSC, UPSC, IBPS, NET, SET and similar Civil services. Taking this into consideration the Department offers short term course on Certificate Course in Economics. This course encourages students to acquire immense and in-depth knowledge Economics which would be beneficial for their success.

The syllabus committee meeting was held on 08/07/2019 under the presidency of Dr. R. S. Gavit, HOD –Economics and all staff members of department were attended the meeting. Course work structure, syllabus, schedule and examination etc. related discussion was held and decisions were finalized in meeting. All students from BA. II and III, Economics were enrolled for this coursework. The total strength of coursework was 38 students. The regular lectures were started on 12th September 2022 and course work concluded on 14th December 2022. Three papers i.e. a) Economy and Planning, b) Economics of Development and International Trade and c) Agriculture Economics were taught by Dr. R.S. Gavit, Dr. M. T. Jadhav and Dr. P. A. Yadav respectively. Each subject allocated 20 theory lectures.

Final exam of course work was conducted from 21st December to 23rd December 2022. Students have taken examination on question papers provided on exam scheduled days, which consist of 25 questions on subject syllabus and carry two marks for each question. After evaluation of the response sheets, those students who secure at least 50% marks (150 marks out of 300 marks) are awarded certificate of course. The result is 100% and all students' progress was eye catching. 63 students awarded excellent grade and 11 students awarded with first class. The certificates for all enrolled students were distributed in college Prize Distribution Ceremony Programme.
